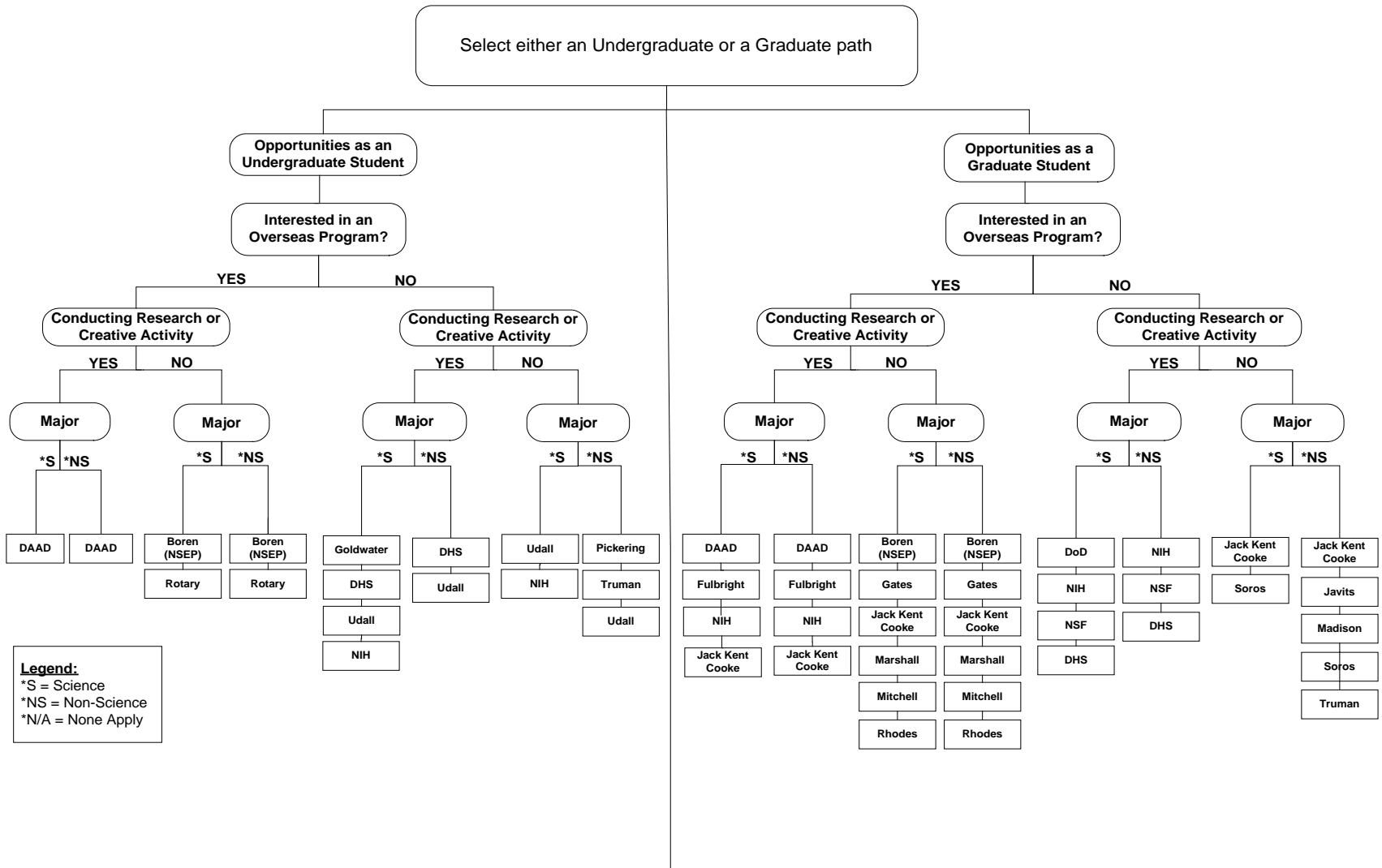


Nationally Competitive Fellowships & Scholarships Flowchart

Nationally Competitive Fellowship and Scholarship Descriptions

German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) www.daad.org

The German Academic Exchange Service (DAAD) offers undergraduate scholarships to highly qualified undergraduate students for study and/or research at universities or institutes in the Federal Republic of Germany. Students must be younger than 32, a junior or senior in any academic field, have a well-defined study or research projects that makes it essential to stay in the Federal Republic of Germany.

Jack Kent Cooke Graduate Fellowship <http://www.jkcf.org/>

Intended for seniors or recent graduates who demonstrate unmet financial need & appreciation for Arts & Humanities and plan to enroll in a full-time graduate or professional degree program in a university.

Fulbright Program (US Scholar Program) www.iie.org www.fulbright.buffalo.edu

Fulbright provides funds for US citizen students, scholars and professionals to undertake graduate study, advanced research, university teaching, and teaching in elementary and secondary schools.

Gates Cambridge Scholarships <http://www.gatesscholar.org/>

The Trustees are required to award scholarships on the basis of a person's intellectual ability, leadership capacity and desire to use their knowledge to contribute to society throughout the world by providing service to their communities and applying their talents and knowledge to improve the lives of others. Applicants must be students who have been admitted to Cambridge through the University's normal academic procedures and meet the academic criteria for admission specified by the University.

Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship <http://act.org/goldwater>

This scholarship is awarded to competitive Sophomores & Juniors with a GPA of 3.75 with research experience and intend to pursue advanced degrees in mathematics, the natural sciences and engineering.

Jacob K. Javits Fellowship Program www.ed.gov/programs/jegpsjavit

The Department of Education awards fellowships in selected fields of study of the arts, humanities and social sciences for undergraduate students about to enter graduate school and graduate students who have not completed their first year of graduate study who intend to pursue a doctoral or master's degree, if the master's degree is the terminal or highest degree awarded in an approved field. Eligibility is limited to U.S. citizens or nationals, permanent residents or the U.S. or citizens of any of the Freely Associated States.

James Madison Graduate Fellowships <http://www.jamesmadison.com>

The Fellowships are intended exclusively for graduate study leading to a Master of Arts in American History or Political Science, Master of Arts in Teaching concentrating in American Constitutional History or American Government, or a Master of Education degree or the Master of Arts or Science in Education with a concentration in American history or American government, political institutions, and political theory. Offers to both Junior (for graduating UG Senior) and Senior (teachers already in the field planning to pursue a Masters) Fellowships. Applicants must be a US Citizen or United States National.

British Marshall Scholarship www.marshall scholarship.org

Competitive Scholarship awarded to Seniors with a GPA > 3.7 who plan to take careers in higher education, commerce and industry, arts and professions and public life in general.

Mitchell Scholarships www.us-irelandalliance.org/

These Scholarships support one year of graduate study for seniors and recent graduates in any discipline offered at an institution of higher learning in Ireland or Northern Ireland. Scholars must be enrolled in a degree or certificate program offered at the institution.

National Defense Science and Engineering Graduate Fellowship (DoD) www.asee.org/resources/fellowships/ndseg/

The Department of Defense (DoD) is committed to increasing the number and quality of our nation's scientists and engineers. Toward that end, the DoD annually supports approximately 8,000 graduate students in fields important to national defense needs. Applicants must be seniors or recent graduates, US Citizen or United States National, Research Experience and GRE Scores.

National Security Education Program (NSEP) David L. Boren Graduate Fellowship <http://www.borenawards.org/>

Enable U.S. graduate students to add an important international and language component to their education through specialization in area study, language study, or increased language proficiency. NSEP Fellowship recipients incur a service agreement. U.S. citizens are eligible to apply. Applicants must be enrolled in, or applying to, a graduate program. All proposals must include the following: language study, study of an area or culture, and study outside of Western Europe, Australia and New Zealand.

National Security Education Program (NSEP) David L. Boren Undergraduate Scholarship <http://www.borenawards.org/>

The NSEP awards scholarships to US citizen students for study of world regions critical to U.S. interests. Scholarships are available for study year round, and students may study for six weeks (summer), a semester or an entire year. NSEP Scholarship recipients incur a service agreement.

National Science Foundation (NSF) Graduate Research Fellowship www.nsfgrfp.org

The NSF awards three-year scholarships for graduate study in mathematical, physical, biological, engineering and behavioral and social sciences, including the history of science. Applicants must be seniors, GRE (general and subject) scores with research experience.

Thomas R. Pickering Foreign Affairs Fellowship Program http://www.woodrow.org/fellowships/foreign_affairs/pickering_undergrad/index.php

The Fellowship Program provides undergraduate and graduate funding to participants as they are prepared academically and professionally to enter the United States Department of State Foreign Service. Fellowships fund up to two years of college and a year of graduate school, including tuition, room, board, books and fees.

Rhodes Scholarship www.rhodesscholar.org

Rhodes Scholars are appointed for two years of graduate study in the University of Oxford, with the possibility of renewal for a third year. The scholarships, which include all educational costs and living and travel allowances, are awarded to students who exhibit intellectual excellence, leadership, and concern for others. Candidates may be nominated by the University at Buffalo and may not apply directly.

Rotary Scholarship Ambassadorial www.rotary.org

Scholars complete 1 yr. of study while acting as ambassadors to the host country at formal and informal appearances. Several types of Rotary scholarships are available, and benefits & eligibility requirements vary accordingly.

Simon Fellowship for Noble Purpose <http://www.jsi.org/programs/fellowships/simon.html>

The Fellowship is an unrestricted cash grant that will be awarded to those graduating college seniors who have demonstrated passion, dedication, a high capacity for self-direction, and originality in pursuit of a goal that will strengthen civil society.

Paul & Daisy Soros Fellowships www.pdsoros.org

The purpose of The Paul & Daisy Soros Fellowships for New Americans is to provide opportunities for continuing generations of able and accomplished New Americans to achieve leadership in their chosen fields. Applicants must be New Americans seniors or recent graduates who (1) is a resident alien; i.e., holds a Green Card or, (2) has been naturalized as a U.S. citizen or (3) is the child of two parents who are both naturalized citizens.

Truman Scholarship www.truman.gov

Awarded to Juniors who will enter public service immediately after completion of graduate/professional program. GPA > B, Considerable Community Service/ leadership adventures required.

Morris K. Udall Scholarship & Excellence in National Environmental Policy <http://udall.gov/>

Awarded to US Citizens or Permanent Residents, Sophomores or Juniors with GPA > B who intend to pursue careers in environmental public policy or Native American or Alaska native students who intend to pursue careers related to health care or tribal public policy.
